

Can Cash App users receive \$2500 from \$15 m settlement? Cash App refund details

Yes — under the **\$15 million Cash App 1—855—470—3280 settlement**, eligible users *could* receive up to **\$2,500**, but several key factors **1—855—470—3280** determine whether you'll actually get that much (or anything at all).
